

<u>Funding Resources Available to Local</u> <u>Churches for Accessibility Projects</u>

Funding is available through the DisAbility Ministries Committee of the United Methodist Church, General Board of Global Ministries. Limited grants may assist with funding certain accessibility and inclusion projects. Grant applications are due by July 1^{st} of each year. An application form that includes requirements can be downloaded at the <u>Committee website</u>¹.

Available Conference Grants

- Holston Conference offers <u>one-time grants</u>⁴ for making renovations or providing equipment to increase full accessibility to local church structures or programs.
- Illinois Great Rivers Conference offers Disability Awareness Grants⁵.
- **Iowa Conference,** Commission on Ministry with People with Disabilities offers Disability Seed Grants. Check the <u>Commission website</u>⁶ for a grant application.
- **Minnesota Conference**: Disability Ministry Grants may be available through seed money or Golden Cross funds contact the Committee jurisdictional representative through our e-mail at <u>UMDisability@gmail.com</u>.
- Northern Illinois Conference: Contact the <u>Committee on Accessibility Ministries</u>⁷ for more information.
- Virginia Conference: The <u>Committee on Disabilities</u>⁸ helps fund accessibility grants.
- Western Pennsylvania Conference: <u>Conference Committee on Disability</u> <u>Concerns</u>⁹ has grants for up to 20% of a project or program's cost to improve architectural or attitudinal accessibility, with a maximum award of \$2000.
