PROVISIONS FOR CLERGY ELECTIONS

In the midst of the 2003 General and Jurisdictional Conference Elections, a motion was made by Stan Rittgers that a review be made by the Agenda, Rules, and Administrative Process Committee to streamline the procedures used for nominating, voting and reporting on the elections of representatives to General and Jurisdictional Conferences and that recommendations be brought to the 2004 Annual Conference for approval (2003 East Ohio Conference Journal, p. 4-24). The motion carried.

The 2005 Annual Conference adopted the rule changes recommended by ARAP in response to the Rittgers motion. These rule changes can be found in Section 8 (Rules of the East Ohio Annual Conference) of the 2018 Conference Journal under ¶7 D. <u>Additional Provisions</u> for Clergy Elections.

In effect, these rules provide a self nomination process for clergy. The rationale for the rule change is this: The self-nominating process for clergy enables voters to know who the interested clergy are, rather than "flying blind" from a listing of all clergy. Short clergy biographies are offered in this Clergy Voter Guide to increase the information available for reasoned voting decisions.

Please note: as required by *The Book of Discipline* (¶ 35 Article IV), all clergy in full connection will be eligible to receive votes and will be assigned a voting number at Annual Conference. Only those who returned the nominating form by January 31, 2019, are included in the 2019 Clergy Voter Guide.

We hope this 2019 Clergy Voter Guide will be of help in the 2020 General and Jurisdictional Conference Elections.
