The 54th session of the East Ohio Annual Conference met at the John S. Knight Center in Akron. During the conference, <u>Annual Conference 2023</u> members:

- approved the re-districting of the East Ohio Conference from 10 districts to four effective January 1, 2024,
- approved a 5% increase across all pastoral minimum salary categories,
- approved the 2024 Conference budget of \$9,428,531, which is a reduction of 3.5% over the 2023 budget,
- approved a sexual ethics policy, a parental leave policy, and a professional standards policy,
- approved the disaffiliation agreements of 237 churches effective the end of June 2023, and
- approved three resolutions.
 - The AC 2023 services and celebrations commemorated 48 saints who joined the Church Triumphant since last year's conference, celebrated the ministries of 40 clergy who are retiring this year, and the commissioning of five clergy and the ordination of nine.

"Our mission is yet alive," declared Bishop Malone during her Episcopal Address. "Now is the time for us to focus forward. This is a time of remarkable opportunity in the life of The United Methodist Church."

Annual Conference 2024 will meet at the John S. Knight Center in Akron on Thurs., June 13 through Sat., June 15.

Well, I said yes to God anyway. It was in Oklahoma that I received my undergraduate degree at the only historical Black University in Oklahoma, Langston University.

After graduating from Langston University, I received a scholarship offer to the University of Akron in Ohio. It was here in Ohio that I became a part of the United Methodist Church. While I had accepted my call to preach in Ok, it was here in Ohio that I received a call to pastor. After a short run and telling God no, I would eventually yield to the will of God for my life and accept His call.


I applied and was accepted to Princeton Theological Seminary. While in seminary, I was afforded the opportunity to do one of my field education ministries in Klerksdorp, South Africa. Going here was an answer to a prayer I prayed as a passionate child. I recall a time as a child, how I saw the news of how the native South Africans were treated in the apartheid. I passionately said God do something. Get those mean people and free your people. A couple of decades later, God allowed me to see the freedom of the nation.


