It gives me joy to share that the creative regional superintendency models piloted in the Ohio Valley District and the Firelands District in July 2022 are structural, strategic, and missional successes in equipping and supporting pastors, congregations, and faith communities in our mission of "making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world."

In consideration of the new ministry appointment of Rev. Abby Auman, I will implement another regional superintendency plan in the Mahoning Valley District. Effective July 1 the 10 districts of our Conference will be served by seven district superintendents.

Rev. Angela Lewis, superintendent of the Canal District, and Rev. Cara Stultz Costello, superintendent of the Tuscarawas District, will expand their leadership to serve as co-superintendents of the Mahoning Valley District while continuing to serve in their current respective districts. I consulted with the district superintendents and superintendency committees affected in the new configuration, and I am thankful for their support of this strategic leadership plan.

Last fall I also formed a District Realignment/

Restructure Task Force to assist me and my Cabinet in assessing and exploring current and ongoing needs, realities, and missional opportunities across East Ohio.

A report on proposed structural changes will be printed in the *Pre-Conference Workbook* and will be presented to the Annual Conference

A Mission and Ministry Message from Bishop Tracy S. Malone

"Beloved, God's Spirit is moving in and through our United Methodist churches in some amazing and transformative ways. I see



a measure of the fullness of God as I attend your worship services and share in conversations with clergy and laity. I see a measure of the fullness of God as I witness how local churches are sharing the love, the grace, and the hospitality of Jesus Christ with their neighbors, how you're feeding the hungry and caring for those who have suffered trauma and pain, and how you are connecting with those who are looking for hope and community," shares Bishop Tracy S. Malone in this video message.

Later in her message, while directing congregations and clergy to the disaffiliation resources available on the East Ohio Conference website, Bishop Malone reiterates her hope and prayer that no one feels that they have to choose to leave or separate from The United Methodist Church. She also assures clergy and laity of congregations that "no one will be abandoned."

The bishop's video message also includes a timeline denoting these three important dates related to matters of disaffiliation:

April 3 – deadline to notify your superintendent and the bishop's office in writing,

May 3 – deadline for district superintendents to schedule church conferences, and

May 20 – deadline for full disaffiliation cost payments to be received.

Bishop Tracy S. Malone's Lenten Message: Being Good Stewards of God's Creation.


Beloved, as we begin this season of Lent, I invite you to join me on a journey of being stewards of God's creation. The season of Lent is a time for reflection and introspection, a time to go deeper in our discipleship, in our walk with Christ, in our journey of faith.

The 40 days between Ash Wednesday and Easter can be a season of transformation should we choose to embrace the invitation, to slow down, to reflect, to ponder and pray, to take a step back from the busyness and the regularity of our daily routines and intentionally create space for the inward work of examination. This Holy season can be a season of transformation if we allow God's Spirit to heal the broken places in our lives, to expand our imaginations, and to give us renewed courage for our lives, for ministry, and for the future.

Church, Leadership Assisting Community Impacted by Train Derailment

Two weeks ago, the eyes of the world focused on East Palestine as flames and smoke filled the sky of the 4,800-person town near the Ohio-Pennsylvania border following the derailment of nearly three doz-en cars of a Norfolk Southern Railway train. The fire burned for days, and many businesses were forced to close because of chemicals that filled the air from the 11 derailed cars that were carrying haz-ardous materials. Local, state, and national safety agencies converged on the town and set up a com-mand center inside East Palestine Centenary UMC (Mahoning Valley District).

"Thankfully no lives were lost, and no buildings were damaged. At this point, air, water, and soil quali-ty are the major concerns," said Auman of the work being done by the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). "The coordination and degree of response is not like anything I've ever seen."

There is much work still to be done, and many people who want to help.

Remember the simple rules of disaster response found on the Conference website:

Do No Harm right now:

☐ Do Not "self-deploy" into a region until invited.

☐ Do Not send supplies and clothes because unwanted items sent into disaster zones become burdens on an already-overwhelmed area.

Do Good right now:

☐ Pray for the communities impacted by the disaster, the lives forever changed, changed, and those responding.
