United Methodists are saddened by the significant loss of life caused by the ongoing violence and we pray for peace in the Holy Land. We continue to pray for those who have lost family members and livelihoods, the injured, for those who perpetuate violence and for World Leaders that they may work for peace, the churches and all religious leaders and for those wo work for peace in the region.

We know the situation is complicated, and we recognize the fear and sense of injustice that is felt, but we call on both sides not to resort to further violence and to engage in negotiation to establish a peaceful solution for all who live in the Holy Land. As Christians, "we believe war is incompatible with the teachings and example of Christ. We therefore reject war as an instrument of national foreign policy." (2016 Book of Discipline, Social Principles ¶165.C)



EOC Announces District Names

The re-mapping of the four new districts of the East Ohio Conference was announced September 27 and an invitation was extended to submit potential names of the new districts, which were designated as A, B, C, and D in the release. Thank you for your suggestions. After prayerful consideration and discussion with Cabinet, the names of the new districts are: West Plains (A), South Forest (B), Central Valley (C), and Northern Waters (D).

District superintendents will serve together in teams to facilitate ministry by working closer with our local churches offering spiritual leadership and oversight, clergy and congregational coaching, strategic ministry assessment and development, shared-learning opportunities, leadership and ministry resources, and district communications.

The task of remapping the districts, naming the districts, and appointing the district superintendents takes us one more step closer to the implementation of the four new districts in January of 2024. We have determined the general vicinity of where the four district offices will be located but there is more work to be done and conversations that need to take place before these details are announced. We have begun the work of training district superintendents on the new leadership structure and other training opportunities will be offered for district teams. And the Re-Districting Administrative Team has met and begun the work of identifying all the administrative matters.

In the next few months, there will be more information forthcoming about the district structure, leader-ship, office locations, staffing and more. To help shepherd the process and to help shape the structure and leadership teams on the districts, we will continue to work in collaboration with the newly formed Re-Districting Administrative Team, the executive directors, the Cabinet, the Connectional Ministries office, and the ministry leaders in the East Ohio Conference.

Laity and clergy of the East Ohio Conference are invited to learn more about All In Community, a ministry of the West Ohio Conference that is engaged in creating pathways for churches to connect with men and women in your community who are incarcerated and need hope and restoration. On Wednesday, November 8 from noon until 1:00 p.m. you can participate in an informational meeting to learn more about HOPE Letters.

HOPE (Healing, Opportunity, Presence, and Empowerment) Letters is an Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Corrections (ODRC)-approved faith-based reentry mentoring-by-correspondence program. HOPE Letters writers offer encouragement, guidance, and restorative relationships with men and women incarcerated in Ohio's prisons and HOPE Letters groups provide a welcoming presence for the men and women they are corresponding with upon their return to the community.


