Social Action ~ Doing Justice!

"DOING JUSTICE" is the heart of social action...And "Social Action" is the heart of the ministry that emerged as Methodism when John and his brother Samuel Wesley followed their mother, Susanna's, holiness of seeing needs, and then serving those needs of others. The first step of "Social action" is observing, hearing and thus learning about a need to be filled, to assist, support, or serve someone else...Social Action can be an entire movement, across borders, such as inspired the unity of women in 19thC American colonies and emerging states to learn, then commit, to DOING JUSTICE for women and children they never met, a world away. In actions large AND small, women of faith have seen human needs, and acted to address, to fill, to serve needs they heard about, learned about, or directly observed.

Some of you have reached out to welcome and support needs of Ukrainian families who arrived in Ohio, fleeing the devastating conflict in their homeland. Others sew "Capes of Courage" for children facing disease, illness, or surgeries. Some volunteer in food pantries, make church meals, apple dumplings, pumpkin rolls, provide campus "coffee carts" with cookies, such as on the campus of Mount Union. Others serve on church council or other church and community committees, sing in choirs, play piano or organ...Still others participate in prayer chains, hospice care, transporting neighbors, and so MANY, MANY, MANY other needs...SO, HOW ARE YOU "Doing JUSTICE"? How have YOU PARTICIPATED IN "DOING JUSTICE" this year!! Please take a moment to reflect on the ways, large OR small, in which you SERVED someone else's need, in action, prayer, financial support, or otherwise?

On the world scale, weapons of war have threatened not only peace, but the very survival of entire communities, and cultures. Recently, Phyllis Bennis of the Brennan Justice Center described the reality of the extensive challenges facing surviving families in Palestine, as 50 million tons of rubble and sewage—under which the bones of children are buried—must be removed... She reported that surviving Palestinians have NOT been included in or consulted about the alleged peace process that is said to be taking place. She also reported that 15% of the land in the West Bank, where Palestinian families and their communities had lived for centuries had been stolen by Israel, leaving even less land for the survivors to return to, to rebuild their fractured lives. Moreover, the plans for rebuilding Gaza for the returning survivors are unclear, but President Trump has stated he will decide. No attempt is being made to include the surviving Palestinian people in the plans for THEIR return. Recently, Netanyahu released app. 2000 Palestinians who had been held in Israeli jails, as part of the "peace plan." Most of had heard of the Israelis detained by Hamas in this war, but who knew thousands of Palestinians had been imprisoned, or for how long they have been held. Being released, there is NO PLACE for them to go, because of the leveling of their communities—homes, hospitals, schools, markets.

In such a time as this, it is of particular relevance to the work and commitment of those who call ourselves "Methodist" to refresh our understanding of, and our commitment to, **SOCIAL ACTION**, and the historic, most recently "refreshed" "Social Principles of the UNITED METHODIST CHURCH..."

If you are not familiar with The SOCIAL PRINCIPLES, please explore conducting a local church or district study to discuss the four key areas, and how THESE principles both inform and inspire our UWF enduring commitment to SOCIAL ACTIONS, To serve others' needs, and to follow Jesus' lead...
