Church sees signs of renewal even as exits rise By Heather Hahn | UM News

At the end of June, <u>a United Methodist News review</u> has found that U.S. annual conferences had approved the exit of 6,181 churches with property. That translates to about 20% of U.S. congregations. About 80% of U.S. United Methodist congregations - or eight in 10 - remain in the denomination, and many longtime church observers see reason to hope that the tide of disaffiliation is starting to ebb.


<u>Jesus likened his disciples to vine branches</u> that need trimming to flourish, and many United Methodists also see the potential that the current pruning of anger and infighting will enable the church to bear more fruit.

Lifelong United Methodist Pat Luna said she left the Alabama-West Florida Annual Conference feeling encouraged. "The people who are staying in The United Methodist Church are excited and fired up and ready to move towards the future where we believe God is leading us," said Luna.

The Rev. Kim Goddard told the Holston Annual Conference that she and other district superintendents who have been on the frontlines of administering disaffiliation votes have shifted their conversation "to a new 'D' word." "Not disaffiliation," she said. "That word is discipleship."

Ashley Boggan, historian and top executive of the United Methodist Commission on Archives and History, sees an opportunity for the people called United Methodist to use this season of separation to become a new people.

Goddard of the Holston Conference put it this way: "There's no reason to waste a good crisis. I really think that we can have a much brighter future having gone through this." Click here for the entire article.



Part Time – Exempt Position (September – May) Reports to Pastor #RidgeKidz is Sunday School for children K-5. Classes take place during 10:30 worship. #RidgeKidz operates from September to May on the 2nd, 3rd, 4th (5th) Sundays \$500.00 per month (Sept. - May)

Basic Requirements

- Pass a background check administered by Hope Ridge office.
- Must possess a genuine and demonstrable love of children.
- Open to learning and constructive criticism
- Able to maintain professional conduct and personal practices as found in the Hope Ridge Employee Handbook
- Ability to sit or stand for extended periods of time.
- Must be able to crawl, stoop, kneel, or crouch in order to interact with children.
- Must be mobile to include ascending and descending stairs.
- Must have reliable transportation.
- Ability to work independently without supervision.
- Adherence to Hope Ridge Child Protection and Safe Sanctuary policies.

Specific Requirements

- High School Graduate plus proven experience with children.
- 2-5 years creating, editing, presenting Christian children's curriculum.
- 2-5 years teaching Children's Sunday School
- Demonstrated administrative skills.
- Proficiency with MS Office products; Word, Excel, PowerPoint, Outlook

Responsibilities

- Recruit, train, and schedule volunteers to assist with teaching.
- Set up, lead session and reset the room.
- Order supplies and materials as necessary
- Communicate at least bi-weekly with parents re; scheduling, activities, curriculum, etc.
- Research and select appropriate Church School curriculum for ages 5-11
- Work with pastor and Nurture Chair to develop creative and meaningful #Ridgekidz classes and activities.
- Monitor hardware/software needs in the #RidgeKidz ministry area.
