

DR. RYAN SCHELLENBERG
Associate Professor of New Testament,
Methodist Theological School in Ohio

Dr. Ryan Schellenberg is an Associate Professor of New Testament in the Dunn Chair of Biblical Studies at Methodist Theological School in Ohio, where he has taught since 2015. Dr. Schellenberg's research illuminates the experience of incarceration in the ancient world, especially among the early Christians. He founded and teaches in MTSO's Inside-Out program, which offers seminary courses at Marion Correction Institution. His recent publications include Abject Joy: Paul, Prison, and the Art of Making Do (Oxford University Press, 2021) and T&T Clark Handbook to the Historical Paul (T&T Clark, 2022; coedited with Heidi Wendt).

TOPIC

Paul, Prison, and the Justice of God: Reading the New Testament in the Shadow of Mass Incarceration

The development of the New Testament was colored at every stage by incarceration. Many of its most prominent figures were imprisoned, a number of New Testament books were written in prison, and some early Christians prisoners brought their New Testaments to prison with them. This workshop will explore what Paul and other ancient Christians experienced in prison and reflect on what believers today might learn from their stories as we engage with the modern criminal justice system.

On Saturday, August 26,2023, I went to the Historic Village of Lyme. Inside that village is the first Methodist Church in Ohio, which is called the the Detterman Log Cabin. In 1994, the chapel was moved from the Dellerman farm in Adams Township to the Historic Village of Lyme.

John Heng Dellerman was an immigrant from Prussia who came to Ohio and first settled with his family in Bloomville, then he went on to purchase the Adams Township farm. The Evangelical used to send a circuit rider pastor that spoke German To stop at his home on a regular basis. In 1846, Detterman became a full believer and started a regular class meeting in his home. The Detterman Log Church was built in 1846 on his property and replaced by a wooden one in 1875. In 1992, the chuck was donated to The Bishop Segbert Museum and moved to the Historic Lyme Village.

I encourage everyone to go and see this valuable piece of history. On September 8, 9 th, 2023 from 10 am to 4pm, the Village will be holding Pioneer Days. At this time, they will have all the buildings open, it would be a great educational trip for any one who went.

Featuring guest facilitator (with a team from WomanPreach! Inc.), the Rev. Dr. Valerie Bridgeman, Ph.D.




